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Day 1: Irkutsk & Taltsy

Arrive Irkutsk in the morning. Drive towards Lake Baikal, first making a stop at Taltsy Open Air Siberian Culture Museum.

The exposition features wooden buildings brought from all over Siberia! Right now, 40 landmarked buildings and 8000 artifacts dated by XVII-XIX centuries are presented as part of the exhibition. Here you will see the traditional folk-show and have a lunch. Your visit includes interactive program with "matryoska" painting master-class, honey degustation, lunch and Russian tea ceremony.

Late afternoon, arrive at the shore of Lake Baikal in the evening. Today, we will have a welcome vodkatasting.



















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Day 3: Olkhon Island

Transfer to Olkhon Island by special hovercrafts will take 6-7 hours. Packed lunch. We will pass famous Peschanaya bay and visit white marble rock Sagan-Zaba, famous for rock painting (2nd millenium BC).

Hovercraft boat is the best way to experience Winter Ice of Lake Baikal. It is safe and secure.

After settling in our comfy local guest house, take a tour to Shamanka Rock, where the Baikal ruler lives according to local beliefs. Explore the Khuzir settlement, making photos of ice caves and grottoes.

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Day 4. The Journey goes on

Set out for a full day guided tour to the south of Olkhon island. We also visit the island of Ogoy where Buddhists' Enlightenment Stupa with various Buddhist relics, and a bronze statue of the dakini Troma Nagmo, the mother of all Buddhas in Tibetan Buddhism.

Then, we will travel to Cape Khorgoy to see its 185 meters long ancient Kurykan protective wall. As we travel the icy surface of Baikal, you will see how local use the benefits of the nature to arrange their daily routine and how useful the ice can be! Packed lunch today.

Day 5 : More whites

Morning departure by an off-road vehicle (UAZ) to the northern extremity of the island, Cape Khoboy.

We will make stops at the most interesting places on the way, exploring of ice caves and grottoes.

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Day 6: Olkhon- Irkutsk

We start our return to Irkutsk by travelling to The Small Sea (about 1 hour drive) which is actually the straight. Explore another picturesque area and proceed to Irkutsk (3,5 hours). We will also briefly visit Buryat villages en-route and have local lunch.

Irkutsk city tour. The city was founded in the middle of the XVII century. The town is famous for its wooden houses and wooden lace perfectly preserved. In fact, the Irkutsk historic centre is one huge open air museum! Irkutsk is located on the banks of the mighty Angara river and was once used as a place of exile for revolutionary noble men from St. Petersburg and Moscow, for their participation in riots or civil disobedience. The biggest in Irkutsk' history new arrival happened after the famous Decembrists riot against the Tsar in December 1825 where some of high-profile rebels ended up travelling to Siberia with wives and families. Decembrists aimed to eliminate the monarchy in Russia. After very interesting Museum of Decembrist, time permitting, optional visit to a ice-breaker "Angara".








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Day 2: Discover Vladivostok

Full-day (8 hours) guided tour in Vladivostok.

Vladivostok started to grow with the Trans-Siberian when the construction commenced in 189. Amazing landscapes, the ocean, historical sightseeing, naval base, active marine sports, seafood - everyone will find something appealing here, at the eastern side of Russia.

Today you will visit all major highlights: harbour, Submarine S-56, view point Eagle's Nest, Vokzalnaya Square, the monument of the Trans-Siberian Railway, Russky Island.

One of the highlights of the tour is of course Golden Bridge, an astonishing cable-stayed bridge across the Zolotoy Rog (Golden Horn). It is considered the world's 12th longest cable-stayed bridge.

In the evening, take a transfer to the train station to board the train to Ulan-Ude.










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Day 4: On board

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Day 5: Ulan-Ude Tour, Buryatia

Early arrival at Ulan-Ude. Your driver will be waiting at the train station to take you to the cosy hotel in downtown. Guaranteed early check-in.

After breakfast, start the guided city tour. Today you visit Atsagatski Datsan, famous Lenin's head monument, and Old town.

The Buryats practice Tibetan Buddhism but, along with all other religions, this was suppressed under communism. All of the Datsans (monasteries) were destroyed and the monks sent off to the Gulags. Now they are being rebuilt. They are not as big and grand as those in Tibet, somehow they have a more homely, approachable feel to them.

The main sight of Ulan-Ude is Lenin's head monument. Every tourist who is interested in unusual monuments and amazing architecture should see this 7,7 meters-high bronze head of Vladimir Lenin. This monument is the largest head sculpture in the world.

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
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
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
